All of this being said, as I face another New Year, what I know in the known and especially in the unknown is that God has got this, and maybe more importantly, God has got me. Recently, I sat with a friend as he laid in his hospital bed. My friend had been sick for some time. The only problem other than the obvious problem of being sick is that doctors did not know why he was ill. Spending time with him that day, I could tell that he was worried, but more than concerned, he was frustrated. "If I just knew what this was," he said. I have been there. I think we all have. Knowing I have been there, I also knew there was not much I could say to take his worry away. Like all visits, I closed this visit with a prayer, but it is when I said, "amen," he looked at me and declared boldly, "I guess whatever this is... I will figure it out with God."

Come to think of it, that is how we can face every New Year, "Whatever this is... I will figure it out with God." Happy New Year.




TIME AWAY

- Rev. Dr. Hinkle led our devotion. Reading from John 1: 1-14. The apostle John says that grace and truth are given to us in Jesus Christ. It is essential to keep in mind that John regards both law and grace as God's life-giving, world-changing grace. In Jesus we hear that God heals, forgives, embraces outcasts, and prays for those who hurt him. In Jesus we hear that God understands betrayal and denial, suffering and pain, humiliation and death. Jesus tells us that God knows that, both as individuals and as a world, we need a Savior; and Jesus is that Savior. In Jesus we hear that God brings victory over despair, defeat, destruction, and death; and God wills and shares that victory with us, with humanity, and with all of His creation.
